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YOUR CHURCH WEDDING AT GOOD SHEPHERD

A Church wedding carries the promises and responsibilities of the Christian faith. The sacred setting of our church and the ceremony will communicate, by word and symbol, the reality that marriage is instituted by God and has the promise of God's blessing.

This is your wedding. The staff at Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd wants to help you make this day both memorable and meaningful. This guide is intended to assist you in planning and to provide practical information about the procedures at Good Shepherd.

WEDDING DATE AND TIME

Contact the church office to see if the date you have chosen is available. Pending other scheduled events on the church calendar, the time of the wedding is the choice of the bride and groom.



PASTORS

The pastors of Good Shepherd will work with you as you plan your wedding. If you have a preference of pastors, state your preference at the time you request a date for the wedding. Your preference is taken into consideration but will depend on that pastor's availability. Also, let us know if you have a guest pastor who will officiate your wedding.

PRE-MARRIAGE CONSULTATIONS

All couples are required to participate in a pre-marriage retreat and to meet with the pastor 1–2 times prior to your wedding. Consult with the Good Shepherd pastor who will be officiating at your wedding to make these arrangements.

For off-site weddings, additional compensation for round-trip mileage (at the current IRS guidelines per mile) to and from the site is required for both the rehearsal and wedding service.

Couples who are married by a Good Shepherd pastor are required to attend a pre-marriage retreat. The cost of the retreat is \$300.

FEES

No fee is charged to congregational members for the use of the Sanctuary. Non-members are charged a fee for use of the Sanctuary-see fees below. This non-refundable rental fee should be paid at the Church Office at the time of booking in order to reserve the Sanctuary.

Reserving a time for the wedding service and/or reception and paying fees for such use does not entitle the wedding party to exclusive use of all church facilities. It is possible that other activities may take place in other parts of the facility or other times of the day.

If weddings are scheduled on a holiday or holiday weekend, the fees are doubled (with the exception of the Sanctuary rental).

Outdoor weddings require two audio technicians due to extra set-up/take-down.

The bride and groom should make arrangements to pay these fees prior to the time of rehearsal. All fees should be given to the Wedding Coordinator.

WEDDING COORDINATOR

For all weddings held at Good Shepherd, except for smaller or private weddings, it is required that the Good Shepherd Wedding Coordinator work with the couple in planning the details of the wedding. The Wedding Coordinator is able to advise on every aspect of the arrangements—rehearsal, behind-the-scenes coordination, etc. There is a fee for the Wedding Coordinator.

REHEARSAL DATE

The rehearsal date is usually set in consultation with the officiating pastor. The rehearsal should occur a day or two prior to the wedding. It will take about 30 minutes. We encourage you to have the entire wedding party present at the rehearsal.

It is the responsibility of the bride and groom to contact the Wedding Coordinator well in advance of the wedding. See the front of this booklet for Wedding Coordinator contact information.

MUSICIANS

Good Shepherd has a list of musicians available to assist with music for your wedding, including organists, pianists, soloists, and various other musicians. It is the responsibility of the bride and groom to coordinate with the musicians.

We have musicians on staff at Good Shepherd who may be available to play and/or sing at your wedding. Contact these musicians directly to check their availability.

LICENSE

The bride and groom must bring (or send) the marriage license to the Church Office at least one week prior to the wedding as well as the names of the witnesses. These should be full names and printed legibly. Wedding certificates will be prepared prior

to the ceremony. The witnesses will sign the marriage certificates with the pastor before or during the ceremony.

The officiating pastor is responsible for mailing the marriage certificate to the county recorder after the wedding ceremony. You will be contacted by the county once they have received the marriage certificate.



CEREMONY

- † Recessional
- † Postlude
- † Optional (throughout the ceremony): Holy Communion, solos, and/or special music

READINGS

The bride and groom are urged to select one to three scripture readings to be used as part of the ceremony. Poems or other readings may also be included. Some suggested passages are the following:

VOWS

The vows represent the promises of the bride and groom to each other before God and the guests at the wedding. Provision may be made for those who wish to write their own vows, providing they make clear the promises are a life-long commitment and they incorporate elements of complete sharing and love which marriage implies.

MUSIC

Consult with the pastor and/or church musicians about music. A broad range of music is acceptable, as long as it is not disrespectful/offensive. A playlist of suggested songs is available on Spotify by searching, "Jon Dahl Wedding Songs."



UNITY SYMBOL

Couples often include the mutual lighting of the unity candle, symbolizing the oneness of marriage. This is to be done following the vows. The bride and groom are to provide the candles, or other elements, like sand, used in the ceremony.

PHOTOGRAPHY

It is encouraged that all formal pictures of the bride and groom, as well as all formal group pictures, should be completed 45 minutes before the ceremony, so it is done before guests arrive. Videos of the service may be taken using a stationary camera in the Sanctuary. No flash photographs will be permitted during the service

CONDUCT OF PARTICIPANTS AND GUESTS

All members of the wedding party are expected to conduct themselves appropriately. There is no drinking allowed at the church or in the parking lot. **Wedding will be canceled if any participants are inebriated.**

Children in attendance at the wedding must be well–supervised. Use of the Community Life Center/Gym is not included in the wedding reservation. Children are welcome to use the outdoor playground (East Entrance) and the nursery (off the Gathering Space), as long as they are supervised by an adult.

INVITATIONS

If you would like the pastor or musicians to attend your rehearsal dinner or reception, please send them an invitation.



RECEPTION AT THE CHURCH

The Good Shepherd Gathering Space or Community Life Center/ Gym may be available for your wedding reception.

DECORATIONS, FLOWERS, AND CANDLES

All floral decorations are provided by the bridal party and are available at most florists.

When decorations are attached to the pews, no pins or tacks can be used. The type of decoration selected be discussed with the Wedding Coordinator.

We permit live flame for a Unity Candle on the altar, but all other candles must be LED.



DRESSING ROOMS

Rooms for both the bride's and groom's parties are available at the church.

ALCOHOL

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted for any church events. No other alcoholic beverages are allowed on church property, including parking areas.

SMOKING

Good Shepherd is a smoke-free building.

PERSONAL ITEMS

Members of the wedding party are responsible for their personal items (purses, cameras, gifts, etc.). Good Shepherd is not responsible for lost items.

CLEANING UP AFTER THE WEDDING/RECEPTION

Before leaving the church, please remove everything you brought. Be sure to remove the Unity Candle, flowers, bows, etc. Good Shepherd is not responsible for items left after the wedding.



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
